<sup>1</sup> Insurance title codes indicating an employed person falls within groups relating to: employment contracts, civil-law contracts, members and employees of cooperatives, uniformed and non-uniformed services, employees of the justice system, members of parliament and senators, outwork, members of supervisory boards and proxies, members of the clergy, persons working whilst serving a custodial sentence, and persons conducting non-agricultural economic activities.

<sup>2</sup> Employers have been required to provide an occupation code in declarations submitted to ZUS since 16 May 2021. This requirement applies to registrations of new employees hired from that date, as well as to corrections of data for employees already in employment. As Data Blender includes data broken down by occupation, persons employed before that date who have not updated their personal data will not be included in the estimate.

At the same time, data on the number of employed persons for whom an occupation code has been specified are increasing steadily – as a consequence, the database is progressively expanded with each successive edition of the survey.
